All Gender Restrooms

One important part of making a party or event fun for everyone is making sure that the restrooms are accessible for everyone.

The good news is that most private homes and apartments have all-gender restrooms! But what if you're hosting a party at another venue? Here are three things you can do:

- 1. Give your guests an idea of what to expect. Whether or not there are all-gender restrooms in your space, giving your guests an idea of what to expect in advance is helpful. Our example invitation and Facebook event description both include a short section on accessibility; this is a convenient opportunity to letyour guests know what restroom facilities are available.
- **2.** Use accessible restrooms as one of your criteria when you choose a **location.** Look for a venue that has at least one all-gender, wheelchair-accessible restroom that is close to the space where your event will take place.
- **3.** If the venue doesn't have gender-neutral restrooms, ask if you can designate the restrooms all-gender temporarily. Some businesses are happy to oblige if you bring your own signs. We've included printable all-gender restroom signs in this PDF for you to use. There are options for single stall and multi-stall bathrooms. Rather than segregating by gender, these signs will let your guests know what fixtures and wheelchair access to expect inside.








