

The Fortitude Fund Grant Application 2025

Application Overview:

Our application is available online via Kaleidoscope. Please feel free to answer questions in your preferred language. We strive to practice accessibility, so let us know about any other ways we can be more accessible.

This Fund Provides:

- Grant awards ranging from \$10,000 to \$50,000 (organizations are encouraged to apply
 for the amount they need, whether higher or lower). The average grant award size will
 likely range from \$10,000 to \$20,000.
- General operating funds, allowing grantees to allocate resources where they are most needed
- Rolling application process, ensuring funds are distributed until all available funds are moved.
 - Our final deadline for the Fortitude Fund is September 29, 2025, at 6pm PDT.

This Fund is Not For:

- Emergency funding requiring immediate turnaround (funds will be distributed approximately one month after review dates)
- Funding for general activities, events, or programs unrelated to the current sociopolitical climate

Application Timeline & Process

The Fortitude Fund will remain open until all funds are disbursed. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis, with the following key dates:

• First Round of Review: March 7, 2025

Second Round of Review: April 11, 2025

Third Round of Review: September 29, 2025, at 6pm PDT

This is our final cycle of the Fortitude Fund as funds have been moved quickly to community. All applications must be submitted by the deadline in order to be included for review.

The Fortitude Fund will prioritize organizations working in the following areas:

- <u>Black and Indigenous Movement Building</u>: This is specifically for Black and/or Indigenous-led
 organizations that's work involves ongoing efforts to build community power. This includes but
 is not limited to any time-sensitive community organizing and direct action, legal or bail fees,
 leadership training, skills-building, coalition building, and legislative or ballot initiatives
 campaigns.
- <u>2STNBI (Two-Spirit, Transgender, Nonbinary, and Intersex) Support</u>: Assistance for organizations
 that are 2STNBI-led whose work primarily involves supporting trans and non-binary folks. This
 includes but is not limited to ID changes, access to gender-affirming care, mental health
 services, advocacy, and educational trainings.
- <u>Safety and Security</u>: Resources for LGBTQ+ organizations and individuals facing threats, including security planning and legal support. This includes but is not limited to needing to conduct safety planning, purchasing security equipment, changing locations/move to remote work, etc. You do not need to have already faced an incident to apply for this specific priority area.
- Mutual Aid Programs: For organizations that have mutual-aid programs to help support LGBTQ2S+ and BIPOC communities directly.
- Immigration Support: For organizations with programs and/or projects that primarily focus on supporting LGBTQ+ immigrants. This includes but is not limited to legal fees and aid, educational trainings, community outreach, translation and interpretation services, legislative or ballot initiative campaigns, and housing support.
- Housing Assistance: For organizations with programs and/or projects that primarily focus on addressing housing insecurity for LGBTQ+ folks. This includes supporting queer and trans folks who have been displaced and forced to move for their safety, rental and housing assistance, transitional housing, etc.
- Health and Wellness: For LGBTQ+ organizations with programs and/or projects that primarily
 focus on reproductive health, HIV/AIDS support, and/or supporting queer and trans youth. This
 is inclusive of direct services (medical care and support) and indirect services (community
 outreach, education, connection, etc.).
- <u>Creative Collaborations</u>: For LGBTQ+ organizations that are working towards coalition building, establishing networks, and/or partners across their region. This also includes organizations that are partnering with other organizations for new programs.

Leadership Questions

We consider leadership folks in positions with decision-making power. This is inclusive of the Executive Director, any additional Directors or Managers, and the Board of Directors. If you are an all-volunteer group or have a non-hierarchal structure, please include the core group of folks making decisions involved in the work.

By "led" we mean the Executive Director or equivalent title is BIPOC and/or 2STNBI. If you have a non-hierarchal structure or are a volunteer group, "led" means 51% of your core group is BIPOC and/or 2STNBI.
